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

2022 Highlights



1a. Sarod Concert (Online)



On the occasion of the 73rd Republic Day of India, SPIC MACAY Europe was privileged to inaugurate the year with a concert by the celebrated Ustad Alam Khan on the Sarod.

Son of the legendary Sarode Maestro, Swara Samrat Ali Akbar Khan, Alam has been touching the hearts of audiences worldwide for many years. Ali Akbar Khan's careful crafting and guidance shows in each note as well as in Alam's imaginative way of expressing the ancient ragas passed down from the courts of Emperor Akbar by Mian Tansen in the 16th century


The online concert was held on 26th January, 2022 with viewers tuning in across the globe from North America, Europe and India.



1b. Stuttgart Meets Mumbai (Online)

SM Europe participated at the Stuttgart meets Mumbai festival in February 2022. Our volunteers set up a virtual booth at the festival, where all attendees could chat and learn more about the work of the organization and Indian classical arts more generally. In 2022, the festival saw a footfall of over 1000 registrations.





SM facilitated an interactive session with Ustad Wasifuddin Dagar ji who regaled the audience with a short, live Dhrupad concert and then engaged with the virtual audience. SM also organized a session on Naad Yoga, focusing on the intricacies of not only music but also of sound.



1c. Harmony 2022

SPIC MACAY Europe hosted a violin concert series by Dr Mysore Manjunath and his son Sumanth Manjunath in Rotterdam, Aachen, Cologne and Zurich. Dr Manjunath, a Sangeeth Natak Academy awardee, enthralled audiences with an authentic flavor of Carnatic classical music along with his son Sumanth and renowned percussionist and Konnakol artist BC Manjunath. Each concert was held in an intimate venue, where a close interaction with the artists was possible.

The concert in Cologne was held at the Bürgerzentrum Ehrenfeld where chief guests Dr. Jan Reichow, a renowned violinist and music editor, and Vanessa Gruschitz, a member of the Cologne district council, were present. The artists played elaborate expositions of ragas Amruthavarshini and Brindavani Saranga, and ended with the song Vande Mataram in Raga Desh. The concert took place from 18:15 to 20:00 followed by a question and answer session from 20:00 to 20:20. The Q & A session focused on the following topics:

- What is the difference between the rhythm system of western classical and Carnatic
- Are Carnatic ragas associated with time of the day/ angle of the sun, like Hindustani music?
- Why is there no gharana system in Carnatic music?

In 2022, SM Europe was showcased at several street festivals, in Stockholm, Rausgegangen Kreativcampus in Cologne, Germany (Event link in German: here), the Colours of India stall in Voorburg, The Netherlands (Event link: here), and the Maitri foundation festival in Den Haag and a student stall at ISA event in Leuven, Belgium.

Our volunteers came up with a range of innovative ideas for the stalls, from using interactive posters to educate audiences about classical instruments, to offering live demonstrations, to conducting short engaging quizzes with attendees. The stalls were a great success in spreading the reach of the organization to new cities, in finding financial support for our events, and in spreading awareness about our work.




1 e. Baithak (Discussion module)

World music appreciation Baithak, 15th Dec 22

At SPICMACAY Europe chapter, like any other bunch of curious artists, we wanted to know the aspects of western classical music. If Europe isn't the greatest contributor to this form of classical music, then which continent is? So, we decided to interact with a local artist who can help us understand the basic rules in a concert in "lay–man terms". We needed someone to decipher the compositions practiced at the rehearsal for an upcoming visit to the Köln Philharmonie.

We got to know that the instrumentalists of any on type of instruments always are seated at the exact same positions on the stage. From understanding briefly about conductor's job to world of different instruments and their classifications, we just dived into a whole new

A musical discussion is incomplete without talking about the rhythms, isn't it? We had a very brief but an insightful conversation about the rhythmic notations in the Scores and what they are called. Biggest takeaway: The raagas represent the mood in Indian music and so does the rhythm and volume in the Western music.





- More <u>movie appreciation</u> (SM approved) sessions to be added diversify our portfolio of events with small budgeting options.
- • SM will extend this to <u>art appreciation sessions</u>. This could possibly be a snippet of local folklore being explained in detail or even a raga and its beauty, or paintings and art forms.
- Focus on <u>workshops</u> could focus on any of the aforementioned or even things like music instruments, pottery, sculpting, etc.

Proposal to have more baithaks on the grassroots levels. It can be as simple as "what is a shruti box?" or "what is this unique instrument (such as mandolin)?" Something simple can always be intriguing for anyone. Formulate events and baithaks that people can associate with on a daily basis. SM Europe should start maintaining Blogs for audience to read to know recent developments or interesting ideas on art and music.

- 1. SPIC MACAY Europe intends to reduce profit made by ticket sales, as it aims to make arts accessible to the youth for free. However, in the first 3 years we are ticketing our events to support initial costs until we establish our name.

- 3. We have partnered with like-minded foundations in Switzerland to leverage resources and reach.
- 4. We have active fundraiser events like street festivals to raise awareness and donations for our cause in Köln (DE), Delft (NL), Stockholm (SE), Zurich (CH).
